SOME DREAMS DO COME TRUE — Michael Plumpton

In the Summer of 1947, when I was ten years old, my family and I went to Cooperstown. We saw the Farmer's Museum and the James Fenimore Cooper House. From that time on I dreamed about the day I could start a museum in Marcellus, NY.

In the Fall of 1959, some twelve years later, I called Lucy Sweet, the Town of Marcellus Historian, and talked to her about starting a Marcellus Historical Club, that's what it was first called. She wasn't sure that there would be that many people interested. I went ahead, and made arrangements for the new group to meet at St. John's Parish Hall in January of 1960.

The Marcellus Historical Club was born. I asked Frank Griffing, a renowned senior citizen, to come and share his memories of Marcellus. It was also his birthday and we had a cake for him.

The first official meeting was on January 25, 1960. Eighteen people attended; Mrs. Charles Hopkins, Wallace Campbell, Jack Haley, Barbara Pittinger, Kate Webb, Henry E. Phillips, Michael Plumpton, Ruth & Frank Griffing, Robert Harrison Sr., John Withey Sr., Mr. & Mrs. Stephen Potucek, Mr. & Mrs. Emerson Patterson, Mrs. Eva Chrysler, Mrs. Ethel Feeney, and Lucy Sweet. On November 28, 1960, our name became the Marcellus Historical Society.

Because, as a child, she often hurried up West Main Street to school, not knowing whether she would be late, Mrs. George Case was inspired with the idea of donating a clock to be placed in the Methodist Church tower. From the time of its installation in 1909 until the opening of the Central School on Reed Parkway in 1937, the clock served to hurry the dawdlers and reassure the early birds, as they climbed the hill to the old school.



MARCELLUS PARK

Anyone driving east on Platt Road and looking left can see one of the truly beautiful sights in all of Marcellus, Marcellus Park.

Created in April of 1936, it became a park through the Onondaga County Board of Supervisors and public works programs.

On thirty acres of

land, the Platt farm, various facilities were constructed including shelters, rest rooms, tennis courts and a wading pool. In 1960, as a result of construction of Lee Mulroy Road, sixteen acres were added to the northeast corner of the park. This land was part of the right-of-way for the former Marcellus and Otisco Lake Railway.

There have been three footbridges that have spanned Nine Mile Creek. The original bridge was destroyed by ice and floods in 1961. A wooden cable bridge was built to replace the original footbridge. It truly added to the "feel" of the park. In 1972, the current steel bridge replaced the cable bridge.

Today, Marcellus Park hasn't changed much. There is plenty of parking and more rest rooms have been added. Within the park there are many beautiful settings for a picnic or leisurely walk. Beach volleyball courts, horseshoes and tennis also take up areas at Marcellus Park.

So, next time you're driving down Platt Road, either east or west, take time to look or even stop in at one of the most beautiful areas of our history in Marcellus.






