#### St. Francis Xavier Church Steeple

On the site of St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Marcellus, there once stood a tavern, one of the most popular between Syracuse and Auburn. Built by Deacon Samuel Rice in the early 1800s, it was the third frame building to be erected in Marcellus and on its second floor, a young Catholic congregation in Marcellus, mostly immigrants from Ireland, began to hold services, beginning in 1854. For a dozen years or more, from 1854 to 1867, while a mission of St. Joseph's Church in Camillus, services for the growing Catholic community in Marcellus were conducted in the tavern.

In 1867, St. Mary's of the Lake in Skaneateles became an independent parish, with St. Francis Xavier Parish in Marcellus as a mission. That same year, a fund was started by Rev. Francis J. Purcell, the Skaneateles Pastor, for the erection of a proper church in Marcellus and with the loyal support of the congregation, the old tavern was torn down and on its site, the present Church of St. Francis Xavier, a large and substantial brick building, was completed in 1868.



For over 150 years, SFX Church has stood on the corner of South and Main Streets, its 100-foot steeple and cross serving as a welcome inspiration for all who pass by or enter or leave its portals. For 150 years, that steeple has witnessed thousands of baptisms, weddings and funerals, numerous first communions, confirmations, visitations and counseling sessions. It has welcomed twelve resident pastors and as many assistant pastors, and has seen the history of Marcellus pass by – a procession of farmers, mill workers, veterans, school children, parade celebrants, firemen, and politicians. It has seen our parish grow from a membership of about 20 to over 2000 people at present.

It has observed the acquisition of other property necessary for the functioning of a religious community including a parish cemetery, the building of a rectory next to the church, of a parish hall, of a three car garage, a church parking lot, and a religious instructional center – all attesting to the remarkable foresight and oversight of dedicated clergy and lay trustees through the years. Today that foresight continues to be exhibited as renovation, upkeep and modernization including handicapped accessibility have found expression in a number of worthwhile and most beneficial projects conducted by church leaders.

In its 150 years, it has weathered many storms, along with necessary maintenance and modernization throughout that long history. Recently, the steeple itself needed some major renovation and while the congregation has been remarkably generous over the years in maintaining church property, it now became necessary for this generation of parishioners to shoulder the burden of a major capital



campaign – one that will light the future for those who will follow.

As part of an evaluation of the entire SFX campus, the steeple was inspected and found it to be in tough shape. Engineers assessed the steeple and determined that structurally, the masonry (brick) work was in good condition, as was the heavy timber framing of the upper section of the tower. However, the wooden exterior of top section of the steeple was deteriorating rapidly. Parts of the tower (primarily trim pieces) have been falling on the ground over the past year, large sections of the wall panels have rotted completely through, and wooden access hatch to the upper tower is split in half and has been open to the elements for years.

It was recommended that repairs be initiated as soon as possible – an expensive project particularly because of the difficult access (lift/ scaffolding) requirements. Following the successful implementation of a capital improvement project in the spring of 2020, actual construction began in the late summer with brick and mortar pointing and cap work on the upper tower as well as repointing of the main structure's masonry joints where necessary.



This was followed by major reconstruction of the upper steeple, the availability of several articulating boom lifts, rather than scaffolding, enabling the project to move ahead at a steady pace, lifting workers up to hard-to- reach areas and confined spaces. Over the course of the late summer and fall, improvements to the steeple included replacement of the access hatch and ladder system in the interior, replacement of the upper and lower roofs, wall panel and trim replacement with durable composite materials, window-screen repair and treatment, soffit and fascia replacement, electrical improvements including extending power and installing light fixtures to illuminate the cross and belfry areas, as well as protecting the cross with gold leaf and replacing the lightning protection.

With the construction completed (pictures can be found on the Church website - <u>https://</u><u>sfxmarcellus.com</u>), within the projected time period of 90 days, Rev. Daniel C. Muscalino, Pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church, mounted one of the boom lifts on Saturday, November 7, 2020 and blessed the Church and its steeple from high above the Village of Marcellus.

The Diocese of Syracuse truly stepped up on this project and several individuals, including Ed King, Mike King, Scott Clements, Rich Aupperle, P.E., a structural engineer who has worked on a large number of churches throughout the Diocese, Barry Kennedy (of Beken Electric) and Jim Boise (of Viau Construction) really helped to make this happen and kept it affordable for St. Francis Xavier Parishioners. SFX Trustee and Engineer Joe Durand, P.E., must also be recognized for all of the efforts and expertise he extended on behalf of his Parish. In the end, this project would not have happened without him.

The Parish of St. Francis Xavier has been a member of the Marcellus community for the last 165 years and the church on the corner of West Main is a reminder not only of its physical presence for all of those years, but also a living testimony to the faith of both the families that founded it and those gen-

erations that followed. Today's parishioners are the beneficiaries of a magnificent inheritance and it will be through their sacrifice and generosity that they are be able to pass on to the next generation the belief and traditions which have given their lives, both meaning and purpose. Like a tree with great roots, St. Francis Xavier's church is well grounded and deep-seated, providing strength and stability, as well as a continuity that links the past with the present and the future.
